## PRESENTING THIS MONTH: RAYMOND R. BERGER

The October meeting of the New York Division, Electric Railroaders' Association will be held on Friday, October 29 2010 (**the fifth Friday of the month**) at the St. John's University Manhattan Campus (formerly the College of Insurance) building, at 101 Murray Street, between Greenwich and West Streets, in downtown Manhattan. The University is a three block walk [1-1/2 blocks south and 1-1/2 blocks west] from the Chambers Street station of the West Side IRT Subway. The doors open at 6:15 PM, and the meeting commences at 7:15 PM. Bring your 2010 membership card with you for admission. #### PROGRAM

This month's entertainment will be presented by National Second Vice-President Raymond R. Berger, who will present a 35-mm slide show of public transportation in the Bundesrepublik Deutschland (Federal Republic of Germany). Most of us railfans are also transit activists, advocating better railroads, rapid transit and urban mass transit networks. Results of these efforts are not stellar; frequently we see a lack of quality services and superior equipment when new lines open.

When these are built, we observe that the most expensive construction and operating costs are employed, resulting in inferior design or inconvenient services because they are over-built, or cut back in scope to save costs, higher than anticipated. Further, we are all poisoned by the automotive, highway and rubber tire industries, all of whom receive over 90 percent of the federal and state monies for new transportation construction grants. We are told these new rail lines absolutely require the most elaborate and lavish construction, bringing costs for new routes to astronomically high amounts, thus discouraging most new starts. As advocates, we can improve our position to defend new and improved mass transit by becoming more informed about what is available, not what we are told by the highway and automotive people what our limitations are.

This show will examine and compare new European urban rail concepts in use, such as Tram-Train and Train-Tram operations, now more than ten years old. An introductory historical background will allow the viewer to better understand the specific transportation development of Nuernberg, Augsburg, Wurzburg, Karlsruhe, Kassel, Saarbruecken, Nordhausen, as well as Dresden, Leipzig and Magdeburg and a sampling of recently privatized German rail services. This introduction will also include a glimpse at the 150th and 175th Anniversary celebrations marking the start of the Germany's first railroad in Nuernberg. Those attending this informative meeting will enhance their knowledge of the result of different improvements that are offered passengers in these cities and which could be used here in America. This will allow you to become better armed to defend our position that public transportation in the United States is in great need of improvement. As an advocate, you will easily recall what you will learn at this Meeting and exhort their implementation in future services. Be sure to join us.
