- A route map of the Puget Sound Power and Light Company's Bellingham, Washington Division trolley lines dated July, 1934. In 1940 a short, stretch of track was retained for freight service and is shown, along with the other car lines. The route of the recently abandoned North Coast Transportation Company interurban also appears. 8 1/2" x 11". Real rare item.
- A route map of the Mount Tom Railroad (trolley) and its connecting tramway lines of the Holyoke Street Railway Company. Complete. 8 1/2" x 11". Fantastic!
- A pamphlet entitled "Rapid Transit - A Reality for Baltimore". This seven-page publication gives a full, detailed description of seven rail routes. It might be compared with Germany's Stadtbahns today, but it was primarily an appeal for the use of a combination of street running on segregated alignments and the use of existing railroad rights of ways. It must be remembered that this proposal came (1962) before today's light rail or heavy rapid transit lines were built. 8 1/2" x 11". Very nice to have if you are interested in Baltimore.
- An 11" x 17" 1962 route map of the seven proposed rail alignments that are discussed in the pamphlet mentioned above. Quite interesting is to see how these proposed routings compare with light rail and heavy rapid transit that were successfully built and are now in operation. A real treasure to have.
- A copy of Volume 2, Number 5 issue of HEADLIGHTS Magazine, dated May 15, 1940. This 8 1/2" x 14" publication is a photocopy of a crumbling mimeographed original, four pages, complete. It is the oldest surviving issue of HEADLIGHTS known. News of the time informed members of current events, just as today. Collectors of HEADLIGHTS Magazine will want this in their libraries.
