Listed below is a description of the material we offer:

- A route map of the New Hampshire Electric Railways, including connecting electric interurban lines and steam railroads, 1911. All lines are shown, including Nashua, Lowell, Lawrence, Canobie Lake, Haverhill, Newburyport, Salisbury-Black Rock, Hampton Beach, Exeter-Portsmouth, as well as the isolated Dover, Somersworth, Rochester, East Rochester and Sawyer lines. 8 1/2" x 11." Quite rare.
- Washington and Old Dominion Railroad Company Timetable #2-A, effective June 26, 1943. This schedule of Saturday service shows the lone round trip made by an electric interurban car between Rosslyn and Leesburg, Virginia. 8 1/2" x 11" and a very unusual collector's item.
- Route map of Hampton Roads Transit new 7.4 mile long electric light rail line in Norfolk, Virginia. Service is scheduled to start in 2010. This map shows all 11 stations and adjacent rail lines and highways. 8 1/2" x 11". A good introduction to a promising light rail network.
- A copy of Volume 2, Number 6, **HEADLIGHTS** Magazine, dated June 15, 1940. This five-page issue is packed with highly interesting electric railroad news of the day. Included is a brief roster of the Jamestown Street Railway Company at the time of abandonment. Every member who has a collection of **HEADLIGHTS** in their library will want this very rare issue, too. 8 1/2" x 14".
- A Souvenir Brochure of the infamous Pennsylvania Railroad fantrip using Class MP-54 cars. This circle tour between New York City and Enola Yard (west of Harrisburg) at the end of electrification, covered many PRR electric lines that normally did not see electric MU cars. It ran on Sunday, August 4, 1957 and the visit to Enola Yard affording many photographs of many different types of steam locomotives. This 18-page brochure is a real treasure; it includes a detailed routing and list of all stations along the entire route. Also featured is a schematic diagram of all electrified tracks, a list of motive power along the route and an explanation of the famous position light signal system, as well as engine whistle signal indications. 8 1/2" x 11". A true must in everyone's library.
